

Backpack Buddies Update

Due to the ongoing hunger crisis resulting from the pandemic, the Backpack Buddies program will not be going on hiatus this summer. Because the program is continuing beyond its normal end date, we will need new packers, food purchasers, deliverers, and new double-bagged plastic bags to deliver food. Groups for any of these roles are still limited to families that are already exposed to one another on a regular basis so that we can keep our volunteers safe. Faith Formation via Zoom

In addition to the upcoming antiracist reading groups, some of our Faith Formation classes are meeting via Zoom. Special Studies meets Mondays at 2pm, Crossroads on Sundays at 9:30am, Generations every other Thursday at 6:30pm, and Agape at various times on Sundays. Update from the Properties Ministry

Our HVAC plant heating and cooling is based on water flowing through piping in the buildings. During winter, heated water is passed across the grill through which air circulates into our spaces. During spring/summer/fall, chilled water is passed across the grill through which air circulates into our spaces. Inside the Infill L1 space (downstairs youth classrooms and current Backpack Buddy area), these lines are routed under the concrete floor then outside to the HVAC plant. During recent months in this area we noticed wetness on the floor. Simultaneously, we experienced inadequate cooling campus-wide and a significant increase in our water bill. After much investigation and testing, Piedmont, our trusted HVAC vendor, is confident they have traced this to these underground chilled water lines. These lines are 6" in diameter; we are talking about a lot of water leaking into the ground.

After discussing several different approaches, the Properties Ministry (supported by the Deacons and Finance) have selected the repair method that minimizes the structural invasiveness of the repair. New piping will be installed overhead in the ceiling of this downstairs space and we will abandon the underground pipes. This approach is also the least costly; approximately \$65,000. Due to the urgency of the needed repairs, we have approved this quote and seek the church's direction on the source of funds at the Called Business Meeting this Wednesday, September 9.

For the last three years leaders from our church have invested their time and talent to build ONE Wake: an exciting new broad based social justice organization composed of 41 religious and non-profit organizations across Wake County.

During the Founding Assembly, ONE Wake will:

(1) Announce the results of an ambitious non-partisan effort to contact over 20,000 eligible voters for voter registration and assistance with absentee ballots;

(2) Unveil its social justice action agenda on affordable housing, education, and jobs created with the input of over 3,300 Wake County residents;

(3) Invite candidates from every party, elected officials, and corporate leaders to work with ONE Wake and our church to address these important issues;

(4) Kick off a non-partisan Get-Out-The-Vote Campaign to ensure that every registered voter in our community votes in the upcoming election.

The total turnout goal for this event is 2,000 members from ONE Wake institutions. Greenwood Forest has pledged to deliver 75 people.

ONE Wake has been active this year in an attempt to lessen the harsh impacts of the Coronavirus on folks who are struggling more now than ever before. One of its most recent successes was supporting the allocation of over \$7 million dollars in emergency federal funds to be used for homeless families and families needing housing assistance in Wake County. ONE Wake also supported the RIMA (Raleigh Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance) walk in downtown Raleigh following the murders of George Floyd and others at the hands of police.

The current initiative being undertaken by ONE Wake focuses on our readiness to vote in the upcoming 2020 election. Each member institution wants to support 100 percent voter registration in its own organization and to encourage everyone to develop a plan for voting in the upcoming election. For members of GFBC who are not already registered to vote, ONE Wake Core team members can help you register electronically.
