

Blood Drive on June 4: Two Ways You Can Help


Our annual "Be a Hero" Blood Drive is one month away and we need your help! On June 4, you can help in a two different ways:

Thank you for considering this opportunity to save a life!



Ways to Tithe

- 3. Set up an automated bank draft by filling out the form requested from the church office, attaching a voided check, and mailing it back to the church office.
