

A Penny For Housing

One of the founding issues member institutions of ONE Wake selected to address was housing in Wake County. ONE Wake is currently addressing housing in different campaigns among the various municipalities in Wake County. The Cary campaign is called A Penny For Housing. The Town of Cary has plans for creating and preserving affordable housing, but it has invested few local resources to implement those plans. Meanwhile, everyone from teachers, healthcare workers. first responders, service sector employees, people on disability, and others we know, care about, and depend on can't afford to live in Cary anymore. ONE Wake is asking that the Cary Town Council prioritize a budget that sees a penny of the Town's tax rate go toward creating and preserving affordable housing.
