Penny for Housing Campaign

Our congregational partners in Cary in ONE Wake have been discerning a campaign to propose a policy to the Cary Town Council in advance of the spring elections and during the budget process for next year. We would love your investment in this campaign. You can learn more below.

What are Cary churches proposing?

That the Cary Town Council prioritize a penny from the property tax rate generating an annual, local fund for affordable and workforce housing development and preservation. ONE Wake's initial work suggests this would equal \$35/year of the taxes paid by the owner of a home valued at \$350,000 and would total \$3 million/year added to the fund.

Who would this solution help?

Teachers, healthcare workers, first responders, service sector employees, people on disability income, and others we know, care about, love, and depend upon. Many of these people are becoming unable (or are already unable) to live in Cary. In 2016, the Town of Chapel Hill approved a similar Penny for Housing initiative and the annual fund has led to the addition of about 300 units of affordable housing that would have otherwise not been built.

Where has this solution been successful in the past?

In addition to the Town of Chapel Hill, both Raleigh and Durham have enjoyed similar success with both housing bonds and a Penny for Housing policy. Cary remains the only major municipality in the Triangle without either a housing bond or Penny for Housing fund.



How can I support Penny for Housing?

The Wonder Room Now Open!

Last week, we opened The Wonder Room, our new space for children (K-5) during Faith Formation. Below is an interview with Rev. Wesley Spears-Newsome, who designed the space:

Q. What led to the development of The Wonder Room?

Wes: For a long time, we've wanted to fashion an experience for children on Sunday morning that was both engaging for the kids and sustainable for adults. The Wonder Room is a kid-driven, exploration-focused room that can accommodate all kinds of learning and adult engagement. Kids with different learning styles and abilities will all find something for them in The Wonder Room and adults don't need to plan a lesson every week. The room and its stations teach on their own in some exciting ways!

Q: Why is it called The Wonder Room?

Wes: At my ordination, we did a similar thing that Greenwood Forest does at our deacon and clergy ordinations where you get individual messages from those in attendance. One of my professors in children, youth, and faith formation told me at my ordination the saying that's on the materials for The Wonder Room: "wisdom begins in wonder." I believe the wonder that exploration and play give to kids is essential for their development and their maturity. It's through wonder that we uncover many of the most important truths in life. That discovery is part of what church is for, especially in The Wonder Room.

Q; How did the first week go?

Wes: It was so much fun! Our youth joined a few adults in showing the kids around the room. We rotated between the four sections (Play, Reading, Crafts, and Church) and the kids never wanted to leave the section they were in! It's almost as if we needed to remind them, "You'll be here every week, don't do everything today!"

Q: Can adults enjoy The Wonder Room, too?

Wes: They certainly can! We tried to design The Wonder Room to accommodate a spectrum of ages and abilities of adult volunteers. There's seating throughout the room and no requirement to be on your knees with the kids. All you need is a heart open to our children and a spirit open to wonder about God.

Feel free to stop by The Wonder Room and explore a bit for yourself on your way out after worship today!
