In honor of Black History Month, our worship services in February will feature music from Black composers and artists, as well as liturgical elements from the African American Heritage Hymnal. We will crown our celebration of Black History Month by welcoming the NC Central University Choir on Sunday, February 27, who will be joining our own Sanctuary Choir to sing Robert Ray's Gospel Mass.

We celebrate Black History Month alongside our Black congregants and Black siblings everywhere as a way to honor Black stories, beauty, and contributions, but also as a way to signal our continued commitment to Black lives throughout the year. We celebrate Black History Month, not as an excuse for normalizing White history and culture for the remainder of the year, but as a way to catalyze within our institution and the world the important work of decentering whiteness, so that all God's children might thrive. For us, Black History Month is not a way to absolve ourselves of the year-round and life-long work of anti-racism, but a moment to celebrate and to recommit ourselves to the gospel work of inclusivity in our worship and in our lives.

ONE Wake Internal Assembly Feb. 24

On February 24, ONE Wake members from across Wake County will gather for our first virtual internal assembly of 2022. The agenda for the meeting includes the ratification of a 2022 power strategy and organizational budget.

2022 is going to be a big year for ONE Wake's institutions and our communities! We are anticipating an action-heavy spring to support existing campaigns to win a dedicated affordable housing fund in Cary and a new property tax assistance program in Raleigh and Wake County to prevent the displacement of long-time, low-income home owners.

Current plans up for discussion and vote at this meeting include organizing training sessions and a significant, non-partisan Get Out the Vote effort timed with Cary's delayed municipal elections.
