# Staff Anniversary: Rev. Spears-Newsome

The first week of January we celebrated Rev. Wesley Spears-Newsome's 5th anniversary of serving as our Associate Pastor

of Community and Youth. We are very grateful for Wes' five faithful years of ministering in our church and greater community. From leading our youth, to coordinating our church's participation in ONE Wake, to lending his design talents to the church website (and this very bulletin), Wes' talents, gifts, and efforts are very appreciated. Be sure to give Wes a great big, "thank you!"



# ONE Wake 2021 Accomplishments

- Secured the commitment of Cary Town Council Candidates for the Penny for Housing plan. 350 households attended this action.
- \$380,000 won in compensation for displaced residents in Wake Forest (average \$11,000 per family for relocation expenses).
- Fought alongside Las Americas residents (Cary) for them to receive at least 50% of their outstanding titles.
- Supported the rezoning of public land in Holly Springs for 124 units of affordable housing.
- Won commitments of support for a property tax assistance program from the Raleigh City Council and the Chair of the County Commissioners.
   600 people attended this action.
- 25 print and television stories generated by ONE Wake on affordable housing.
- 333 new and existing leaders attended IAF University training and 5 new institutions joined ONE Wake.

### What's Next in 2022?

ONE Wake is committed to pursuing the goals established by its member institutions (including GFBC) concerning housing, jobs, and education. The next big step in Cary is a Get Out the Vote (GOTV) campaign for the 2022 municipal elections.

The goal is to contact at least 1,500 Cary voters through a strictly non-partisan GOTV campaign with a combination of relational phone calls to members of our institutions and limited door-to-door canvassing in our community.

# **Omicron Update to Covid-19 Precautions**

Dear GFBC Family,

We are monitoring the recent COVID-19 surge caused by the new variant closely and wanted to send you an update. The information coming out about Omicron suggests:

- 1. Omicron is more infectious than the original strain of COVID (although it's unclear if it is more or less contagious than the Delta variant at this time).
- 2. People (both children and adults) infected by the Omicron variant tend to become less sick than other variants; **while it is more contagious, it** *seems* **less virulent.**
- 3. Although there have been breakthrough cases, **vaccination and boosters** *significantly* **reduce the risk of serious illness** from Omicron (as well as other variants)
- 4. Omicron, like all COVID variants, is an airborne illness (spread through small particles called aerosols not just larger droplets), but there are proven strategies for mitigating the risk of spreading airborne illnesses.

While the data are unclear on how effective the total lockdowns implemented in 2020 were at mitigating the spread of COVID, the science is very clear on the effectiveness of several interventions, which are much more sustainable long term:

- encouraging vaccination
- gathering outdoors (when possible)
- universal masking while indoors
- ensuring good ventilation
- following responsible isolation and testing protocols when symptomatic, etc.

Although gathering outside would be the option with the least amount of risk, the weather over the next two months will make that impractical/impossible. A few congregations in the Triangle have chosen to go to virtual worship for a period of time. We, however, feel comfortable continuing in-person worship for the following reasons:

 Ventilation in our Sanctuary is very good, and the size of space is conducive for disbursement of any aerosols that may escape masks. We will be using a portable air quality detector to continue to monitor the Sanctuary's ventilation and ensure that it stays at safe levels

- Vaccination percentage in the congregation is very high and those who are unable to be vaccinated at this time (children under 5) are, in the vast majority of cases, in a separate wing from the adults while they are at church
- The other precautions we have in place (masking, distancing, keeping length
  of service short, minimizing congregational vocalization, etc.) make risk low
  for everyone as long as we continue to abide by them strictly.

In that spirit, we would like for you to note the following updates/reminders:

- 1. If you are able to be vaccinated and have not yet, we strongly encourage you to do so. If you are vaccinated but not yet boosted, we encourage you to get boosted as soon as you are able. If you need resources or information on vaccination, please contact the church office
- 2. Do <u>NOT</u> come onto campus with any COVID symptoms (fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea)
- 3. Ensure you have a tightly-fitted mask on before you enter the building and at all times while inside. We recommend upgrading to an N95/KN95, but if you are wearing a cloth mask, make sure it A) fits well (covers mouth and nose tightly, has no gaps around the perimeter of the mask) and B) is multilayered or you are double masking with a surgical mask
- 4. Follow all CDC/NCDHHS isolation guidelines if you have been, or think you may have been, exposed to COVID. Do NOT come to church if you are within isolation/quarantine time frame even if you are asymptomatic.

Until this surge has abated, we are reinstating the following precautions that we had loosened:

- No food or drink will be offered at indoor events to discourage removal of masks
- We will pause on taking communion in worship
- During worship, the congregation will only sing the closing hymn to avoid the generation of too many aerosols early in the service
- Lay speakers will use a separate lectern when leading in worship
- The ministers will do pastoral care via phone and electronic communication, except in end-of-life situations.
