
Welcome

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

New Faith Formation Series Begins Sunday!

Gerard Manley Hopkins wrote, "The world is charged with the grandeur of God." In this series, we'll test the hypothesis that every thing is sacred by looking at "secular" music and how it speaks to our spiritual lives. Each week, Rev. Dr. Stacks will select and perform a song and we will break down the song and discuss its resonance with our faith journeys. (January 15, 22, and 29)

Discipleship Retreat

This year's Discipleship Retreat will feature an exploration of what it means to pray and how we can strengthen our prayer lives. The weekend will feature sessions led by the ministers on a wide range of prayer styles including food and prayer, praying with nature, Ignatian imaginative prayer, and prayer journaling. We'll use James Martin's book Learning to Pray as our guide for the weekend (February 24-26). The registration fee is \$35 and includes the book and 3 meals.

The Passing of the Peace

The passing of the peace is a symbolic enactment of the reconciling love and mercy of God in our midst. We express it through a peace sign, a handshake, a wave, or many other expressions of peace. Be mindful and considerate of others' desire for physical space or distance.

Prayer in Worship

We use many kinds of prayers in worship. The Call to Worship is a communal prayer using call and response. The Invocation is a single individual inviting (or invoking) God into our worship this morning. The Prayers of the People uses intercessory prayer to ask God to come to the world's aid. The benediction is a blessing offered over those gathered in worship.

Bulletin Art

"On the Seashore," Rev. Spears-Newsome with Al-Assisted Art Creator DALL-E

Three people walk along the shore of the Sea of Galilee, a pivotal location in the ministry of Jesus. They look out at the hills in the distance on the other side of the water as if contemplating their future travels across the sea. They wear red, the color of Pentecost or of the Holy Spirit, symbolizing the movement God will generate in their lives.

Who are these three people? It could be John the Baptist and his disciples waiting for Jesus, looking ahead to what God will do in his ministry. It could be Jesus and the two disciples of John the Baptist who begin to follow him in today's passage. It could be Andrew and his brother Simon following Jesus, too. Or perhaps one of the figures could be you.

This digital painting is in the style of the expressionist movement, a style of art where reality isn't paramount. Instead, the feelings conveyed by the image are primary. I hoped that this image could convey the desire of the figures to move forward toward the sunset (or sunrise!). The desire for forward movement is their desire to align themselves with the Spirit of God.


Where in your life do you have the desire for forward movement? Where is the Spirit urging you on?
