Two in the Desert; Al-Generated Image (DALL-E)

This week, our bulletin image is shaped like the rest of our service: by our youth. The youth came up with a general idea and prompts to provide an artificial intelligence to generate an image that evoked their imaginations and perception of the story of Hagar.


Here, a tall figure looms over a smaller one in a desert setting. The taller figure represents, for our youth, the authorities and power-holders who overlook, neglect, or otherwise disregard those without power, especially minors.

Christian author on parenting Cindy Wang Brandt often remarks that "children are a marginalized group." Our world is not build for the thriving and humanity of children and youth; more often it is built to exploit them or simply contain them.

We've been studying the whole story of Scripture through the lens of often-overlooked women this year in Alpha & Omega. The youth chose Hagar's story to share on Youth Sunday because they felt kinship with her character. They highlighted how so many young people in our country feel "tossed out" and left without support like Hagar while simultaneous being expected to shoulder huge responsibilities for which they have not been prepared — or for which they are acting as surrogates for adults who should be taking care of things.

In the end, however, the story of Hagar reminds us that God meets us in places where we have exhausted our resources. God will be with those who have been "tossed out," and those who have been neglected and marginalized like Hagar are perhaps the ones who know God the best. After all, Hagar is the only person in Scripture who gives God a name.

\$500/person; includes transportation, lodging, and meals in Alabama.




Welcome





















Announcements Church Events and Updates

The Passing of the Peace

The passing of the peace is a symbolic enactment of the reconciling love and mercy of God in our midst. We express it through a peace sign, a handshake, a wave, or many other expressions of peace. Be mindful and considerate of others' desire for physical space or distance.

Prayer in Worship

We use many kinds of prayers in worship. The Call to Worship is a communal prayer using call and response. The Invocation is a single individual inviting (or invoking) God into our worship this morning. The Prayers of the People uses intercessory prayer to ask God to come to the world's aid. The benediction is a blessing offered over those gathered in worship.


When you pass through the waters I will be with you And the depths of the river shall not overwhelm When you walk through the fire you will not be burned I am the Lord, I am the Lord
