



### Bulletin Art Ananias and Sapphira

Samuel Songo (Zimbabwe, c. 1940)

The painting on the cover of this week's bulletin illustrates the story of Ananias and Sapphira in its substance but also its context.

The painting itself depicts Ananias carried by others for burial while Sapphira speaks with Peter. They carry Ananias not just from life to death, but from inside the community to outside of it. Ananias and Sapphira's sin was not simply a lack of generosity but undermining the sustainability and stability of the community to which they had committed themselves. The painting depicts that reality in the distance created between Ananias and the village where Peter speaks with Sapphira.

The painting is by Samuel Songo, a child when he made the painting. Songo had significant physical disabilities and studied art at a Mission School in Zimbabwe, then Southern Rhodesia under control of the British Empire. The Mission School at Cyrene was a collaboration between a Scottish clergyman, British allies, and local leaders. Focused on indigenous art, the mission produced numerous prominent artists and craftspeople in a time of intense segregation and discrmination in modern-day Zimbabwe. At the time, the government was controlled by a White supremacist minority who exploited the local population. The Mission School worked to counter-act those systems of oppression through art. The chapel at the mission has a multi-panel mural depicting Africans as characters in the Scriptures, including a mural of a Black Jesus, which was considered controverisal by White imperialists.

It cannot be lost on us that these White imperialists claimed to be Christians, much like Ananias and Sapphira. They too pledged their lives to the Christian community, but in practice they took from and exploited others. Their principle concern was for the preservation of the British Empire, not the dignity and humanity of their siblings in what is now Zimbabwe. Colonialism sought to preserve much for the colonizer with little to no regard for the colonized, which Ananias and Sapphira were doing by maintaining their own funds while depending on the Christian community for their daily life and needs.

In what ways do we participate in systems that help ourselves but take from others at the same time? How can we help develop a community of abundance where everyone has what they need?

#### **Prayer in Worship**

We use many kinds of prayers in worship. The Call to Worship is a communal prayer using call and response. The Invocation is a single individual inviting (or invoking) God into our worship this morning. The Prayers of the People uses intercessory prayer to ask God to come to the world's aid. The benediction is a blessing offered over those gathered in worship.

#### The Doxology


A "doxology" is a short hymn that usually praises the Trinity. We sing the doxology as we symbolically present our offerings back to God.

#### Final Hymn: An Invitation


