The Passing of the Peace

The Doxology


A "doxology" is a short hymn that usually praises the Trinity. We sing the doxology as we symbolically present our offerings back to God.

The Prayers of the People


This prayer typically has five parts: a confession, prayers for the earth, prayers for the world, prayers for the church, and prayers for those with needs in our own community.


Communion






Bulletin Art Priscilla and Aquila

Digital Collage inspired by Acts 18:1-11

I came across this image of Priscilla and Aquila reading either sacred texts or potentially a New Testament epistle. That Priscilla is holding the text while Aquila looks on represents the radical nature of their partnership. Priscilla is mentioned before Aquila when they come up in the New Testament all but one time, a rare occurance in literature of the time, suggesting that she had great prominence in her own right. Other New Testament letters suggest that she was most likely the regular pastor of a house-based congregation. She and her husband were good friends with Paul as well as teacher to Apollos, another prominent early Christian teacher. Some scholars even speculate that Priscilla may be the author of the anonymous Epistile to the Hebrews in the New Testament.

The rest of the collage takes some nods from Orthodox iconography. The gold in the background and the presence of saintly halos around Priscilla and Aquilla come from that tradition, as does the red frame and presence of their names in Greek. Orthodox icons are meant to be windows to another, more heavenly reality, and they highlight people of great importance to our own spiritual lives. Incorportating some elements from that technique seemed fitting because while Priscilla and Aquila may not be the most well-known biblical characters, their contributions mean we owe them a great deal and there's much we can learn from them.
