Bulletin Art The Rabbula Gospels

Illuminated Manuscript

The Rabbula Gospels manuscript is an ancient Syriac Gospels Book by unknown artists and the scribe Rabbula at the Monastery of St. John of Zagba, a location now lost to history. The illumination of the Ascension on the cover of the bulletin mixes imagery from across the Bible. At Jesus' feet are angels as depicted in Isaiah and later in Revelation; the spinning wheels are reminiscent of Ezekiel's visions, and the brown hand of God descends from within the eye-covered angel wings perhaps referencing the writing on the wall in Daniel. Later Christian imagery is also present in the lion, man, eagle, and ox in the midst of the angel wings. These represent the four evangelists who wrote the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John).

Jesus stands at the apex of the scene entering something of a portal to heaven. He holds in his hands parchment, perhaps the instructions he gives to the disciples in Acts 1. Below, Mary stands flanked by two angels, the preeminent interpreter of her son's words here. The angels lecture the disciples (six on each side), though we don't know what they're saying. The scene as a whole is one of shock and perhaps pleading on the part of the disciples. Perhaps they do not understand why Jesus is leaving or where he is going. Mary stands serene and untroubled, however.

What are we to think about where Jesus is now? What implications does that have for our lives?

We use many kinds of prayers in worship. The Call to Worship is a communal prayer using call and response. The Invocation is a single individual inviting (or invoking) God into our worship this morning. The Prayers of the People uses intercessory prayer to ask God to come to the world's aid. The benediction is a blessing offered over those gathered in worship.

The Doxology


A "doxology" is a short hymn that usually praises the Trinity. We sing the doxology as we symbolically present our offerings back to God.
