Welcome Back, Rev. Dr. Boswell!

Rev. Dr. Benjamin Boswell (he/him) serves as the Senior Minister of Myers Park Baptist Church (Charlotte, NC). A former U.S. Army Officer with degrees from Campbell University (B.A.), Duke University (M.Div.), and Saint Paul School of Theology (D.Min), he is a preacher, pastor, author, and civil rights leader who facilitates anti-racist education for people racialized as white and white-dominant organizations. In 2021, he was awarded the city of Charlotte's prestigious Martin Luther King Jr. Medallion, the highest honor given to a person who promotes racial equality, social justice, and community service. He is the author of For the Facing of this Hour: Preaching that Resists White Christian Nationalism and Confronting Whiteness: A Spiritual Journey of Reflection, Conversation, and Transformation.

Ben has served as the Pastor of three different Alliance of Baptists congregations, and as an Adjunct Professor at Leland Seminary and Wake Forest Divinity School. He has also been honored to serve alongside three gifted Alliance clergywomen who have ascended to be the first woman Senior Pastor of the churches they now serve. He is a third-generation minister on his mother's side, father of a 13-year-old daughter named Lucy, and spouse of Andi Stevenson, an amateur Latin dancer and national non-profit consultant. They live in Charlotte with their two hounds.

The Passing of the Peace

The passing of the peace is a symbolic enactment of the reconciling love and mercy of God in our midst. We express it through a peace sign, a handshake, a wave, or many other expressions of peace. Be mindful and considerate of others' desire for physical space or distance.

Prayer in Worship

We use many kinds of prayers in worship. The Call to Worship is a communal prayer using call and response. The Invocation is a single individual inviting (or invoking) God into our worship this morning. The Prayers of the People uses intercessory prayer to ask God to come to the world's aid. The benediction is a blessing offered over those gathered in worship.
