# **Bulletin Art** Beautiful Sunflowers Field

I chose this photograph for this week because of the behavior of sunflowers. If you sat down by the field of sunflowers at Dorothea Dix Park in Raleigh at the right time of year, you'll see rows and rows of sunflowers that turn themselves toward the sun. This behavior in plants is called heliotropism and involves the flower moving for its bloom to follow the sun in the sky. Some plants will bend dramatically to contort themselves toward the sun as if yearning for its warmth. Paul describes creation's disposition toward God in Romans this way: a deep and profound yearning for the divine. Our own souls have the same yearning, Paul says, so we are partners with creation in our longing.


# Welcome





# Faith Formation Series Begins this Sunday!

Dr. Lydia Hoyle and Rev. Bucky Sydnor will present three different interpretive approaches to the story of Lazarus in John 11 on April 14–28. Lydia will teach on April 14 and 21, focusing on Eastern Orthodox and imaginative/contemplative approaches to the text, and Bucky will teach on April 28, focusing on the historical critical approach. It will be a fascinating three weeks of diving into one of the most interesting passages in John's gospel.

# New Sermon Series and Spring Cantata

During the month of April, we'll be reflecting on the role of all God's creation in our faith. The series "The Earth is the Lord's" begins with Genesis and ends in Revelation before we enjoy our spring cantata. On April 28, the Sanctuary Choir will perform Ola Gjeilo's *Sunrise Mass* in worship. The piece is a reflection on creation from space down to the ground. It uses the Latin mass text, beautiful lush harmony, and strings to reflect on the spiritual dimension of our relationship to the earth. It will be a beautiful conclusion to our April worship series on creation care. Make plans to be there!

# **Climate Actions**

As we talk about our relationship with the earth this month, here's a list of actions you can take adapted from the book *Following Jesus in a Warming World* by Kyle Meyaard-Schaap:

- Calculate your carbon footprint at Global Footprint Network (<u>footprintcalculator.org</u>)
- Use LED lights, which use 80% less energy
- Use ENERGY STAR lights, appliances, etc.
- Turn your thermostat up in summer and down in winter
- Turn off lights/unplug devices when not in use
- Run only full loads in dishwasher and washing machine; line-dry clothes
- Purchase renewable energy from your utility provider and take advantage of their energyefficiency programs
- · Consider installing solar panels
- Better seal and insulate your house
- Drive less; carpool, ride the bus, walk, or bike
- Refuse, rethink, repurpose, reduce, reuse, recycle (in that order!)
- Buy durable products over disposable ones
- Research the ecological and social impacts of your purchases (try <u>betterworldshopper.com</u>)
- Plant a vegetable garden or buy a plot at a community garden
- Wash and reuse single-use plastic bags
- Use reusable water bottles
- Compost food waste
- Eat less meat, especially beef
- Buy local products
- Purchase secondhand clothes
- Buy all your produce at the farmer's market this summer
- Buy a share from a local CSA (community supported agriculture)
- Fly less often; when you do, purchase carbon offsets (try <u>climatestewarduse.org/offset</u>)

We use many kinds of prayers in worship. The Call to Worship is a communal prayer using call and response. The Invocation is a single individual inviting (or invoking) God into our worship this morning. The Prayers of the People uses intercessory prayer to ask God to come to the world's aid. The benediction is a blessing offered over those gathered in worship.
