

Bulletin Art Pentecost

Adobe Firefly* with Modifications by Rev. Spears-Newsome

The woman at the center of this week's art could be considered two different ways. First, it is a relatively good bet that Mary Magdelene was among the "certain women" (Acts 1:14) present during initial decision-making in Jerusalem, including of Judas Iscariot's successor. When the narrative moves on to the coming of the Holy Spirit, it's likely that she was present with the other early leaders of Jesus' movement. Here, she is seen dancing with the flames of the Spirit, then and surrounded by a traditional halo of light. However, one could also interpret the image to be that of the Holy Spirit bringing the fires of Pentecost. It's not unusual for the Spirit to be depicted as feminine with a history of this feminine aspect of God dating back to the Hebrew Scriptures, particularly with the image of Sophia (Wisdom) and Breath (a feminine Hebrew word). Here the Spirit brings the tongues of fire to the disciples on Pentecost. In either case, her red dress is either that which is associated with Mary Magdalene or the traditional color of Pentecost. Whichever interpretation suits your meditations on this passage, remember that the coming of the Holy Spirit brings a fire that cannot be quenched and moves us to follow Jesus in the world today.

Prayer in Worship

We use many kinds of prayers in worship. The Call to Worship is a communal prayer using call and response. The Invocation is a single individual inviting (or invoking) God into our worship this morning. The Prayers of the People uses intercessory prayer to ask God to come to the world's aid. The benediction is a blessing offered over those gathered in worship.

The Offertory

During the offertory music, we pass plates across the pews as a way to make our collective offering to God and the wellbeing of this community. A short doxology follows as we offer our gifts.

Final Hymn: An Invitation




