Bulletin Art Mary at the Border

This rudamentary icon was something I made after we learned about the Trump administration's family separation policy in 2018, also a few months after Greenwood Forest church member Gilles Bikindou was kidnapped, incarcerated, and deported by ICE. It depicts Mary, the Mother of God, at the US border wall seeking to get in. She is pregnant with Jesus but, much like in the Nativity, cannot find any respite for her and her soon-to-be-born child. The Holy Spirit sits perched on the wall, weaping for the rejection Mary experiences. Yet in the midst of it, Mary treads on a serpent (a traditional symbol of the defeat of Satan) and the border wall begins to crack. Jesus, as Ephesisans says, breaks down the wall of hostility between us, which is exactly what's happening here. Above Mary are words from Hebrews, a reminder that our earthly systems of citizenship are irrelevant to the designs of God. For the city of God, citizenship is not dependent on our national identities and boundaries. In the city of God, such things are subverted and robbed of their power. But as Mary shows here, we still live in the in-between time before God's reign is fully realized. There remains much work to be done.

Guest Preacher Rev. Isaac Villegas



As a child of Latin American immigrants, Isaac Villegas grew up in the U.S.-Mexico borderlands, in the southwest corner of this country. He moved from California to North Carolina, where he served as the pastor of Chapel Hill Mennonite Fellowship for sixteen years. He was elected to the executive board of Mennonite Church USA, from 2013-2015. He's currently a member of the governing board of the NC Council of Churches.

His writing life has led to his appointment as a contributing editor at *The Christian Century* magazine and to the editorial committee for *The Anabaptist Witness* journal. He writes regularly as a columnist for *The Christian Century* and *Anabaptist World* magazines, and publishes from time to time in *Ruminate Magazine, Scalawag, Commonweal, Sojourners, Faith & Leadership*, and *Conrad Grebel Review*.

The Associated Church Press presented Villegas with their first place Award of Excellence for theological writing in 2018, an Award of Merit in 2019, and the Award of Excellence for Photography in 2019.

Villegas has received two research grants from The Louisville Institute for writing projects: "Gifts of Unity" in 2010, and "Remembering the Dead in the Borderlands" in 2020.


Welcome




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

We use many kinds of prayers in worship. The Call to Worship is a communal prayer using call and response. The Invocation is a single individual inviting (or invoking) God into our worship this morning. The Prayers of the People uses intercessory prayer to ask God to come to the world's aid. The benediction is a blessing offered over those gathered in worship.
