"St. John the Baptist" by Auguste Rodin, cast in bronze; housed at the Metropolitan Museum of Art (NYC)

This early bronze betrays the raw physical and emotional intensity that set Rodin's work apart from conventional sculpture of his era. The saint's gouged eyes, sunken cheeks, and tousled locks convey the spiritual ferocity with which he announces Christ's coming. A painted plaster version of the bust (which Rodin derived from his over-life-size, full-length figure Saint John the Baptist Preaching of 1878) was first exhibited as an independent work in the Paris Salon of 1879.

Rev. Dr. Ben Boswell Preaching on January 19

We're welcoming back Rev. Dr. Ben Boswell to our pulpit this Sunday, January 19.

Rev. Dr. Boswell is a preacher, pastor, author, civil rights leader, and sought after public speaker. Rev. Dr. Boswell recently served as Senior Pastor at Myers Park Baptist Church in Charlotte, NC. Before that, he served as Senior Pastor here at Greenwood Forest Baptist Church. He was also Pastor at Commonwealth Baptist Church in Alexandria, VA, and an Adjunct Professor of Political Theology and Ethics at the John Leland Center for Theological Studies. He was also the lone clergy member of the NC Commission of Inquiry on Torture; a citizen group that worked to expose NC's participation in the CIA's post-9/11 torture program.

Dr. Boswell has received numerous awards and honors for his work as a pastor and civil rights leader. In 2021 he was selected to be one of the Freedom Fete speakers at Trinity Episcopal School, and was awarded the prestigious Martin Luther King Jr. Medallion. The award is the city of Charlotte's highest honor, given to a person who promotes racial equality, social justice, and community service.

He is the author of "For the Facing of this Hour: Preaching that Resists White Christian Nationalism," and "Confronting Whiteness: A Spiritual Journey of Reflection, Conversation, and Transformation."

The Prayers of the People


This prayer typically has five parts: a confession, prayers for the earth, prayers for the world, prayers for the church, and prayers for those with needs in our own community.


Final Hymn: An Invitation

To break every chain, break every chain, break every chain


Anthem Every Time I Feel the Spirit
