## Dr. LaTonya Penny



Dr. LaTonya N. McIver Penny is a native of Leasburg, North Carolina and is the daughter of Tony and Phyllis McIver. After graduating from Person High School, she continued her education at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University where she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree. Dr. Penny earned her Master of Arts Degree from East Carolina University and her Master of Divinity Degree from Wake Forest University. In 2019 she successfully defended her dissertation earning her Doctorate in Ministry from Campbell University.

Dr. Penny served as pastor of New Mount Zion Baptist Church in Roxboro, NC from 2014 until 2021. In 2021 she and her husband Charles Penny II, launched Belonging Fellowship, a virtual ministry committed to creating safe spaces of worship for all and a space where all can belong. Belonging Fellowship is committed to serving in

communities wherever there is need.

Dr. Penny believes that all children are in the "imago Dei", the image of God, and should be treated with love, honor and respect. She is actively involved in many organizations pertaining to children with disabilities and the fair treatment of children. Dr. Penny founded her nonprofit Mary's Grace Incorporated, named after her maternal grandmother, Mary Stanfield, which creates programs and ministries of inclusion with persons with disabilities and their families, in churches and communities. She travels the country equipping churches, communities and schools with skills to include those with disabilities.

Dr. Penny is married to Charles W. Penny II who actively serves in ministry with her and they are the proud parents of miracle twins, Taylor and Hunter.

### **Bulletin Art**

Aaron Douglas, "The Judgment Day," (1939) oil or tempera on board

Originally from Kansas, artist Aaron Douglas relocated to Harlem in New York City to take part in the growing movement of Black art, literature, music, and thought now known as the Harlem Renaissance. He first started painting in the European traditions but his fellow artists encouraged him to look into traditional African art, technique, symbolism, and motifs. He went on to study in Paris and Haiti to develop his artistic voice and aesthetic.

In this work, "The Creation," we see the outstretched hand of the Divine reaching for humanity. This week's Scirpture is from Jesus' "Sermon on the Plain," the equivalent of the "Sermon on the Mount" for Luke's Gospel. The sermon is about how we ought to live, how God created us to live. Consider how God made you to be: doing good, giving to others, showing mercy.

# **Lord's Prayer Update**

During our recent churchwide Faith Formation series on the Lord's Prayer, we've made some updates to our liturgy. First, you'll see an asterisk next to "Father" at the beginning indicating that you may say any title/name of God to begin the prayer. Second, there was broad consensus that "debts" rather than "transgressions" was a more faithful rendering of the prayer and better spoke to its intentions. Many English-speaking traditions already use this language. That is now reflected in the bulletin.

### The Passing of the Peace

The passing of the peace is a symbolic enactment of the reconciling love and mercy of God in our midst, expressed through a peace sign, a handshake, a wave, conversation, etc. We hope you will take the time to greet and speak with those around you or with someone you haven't met!

### Prayer in Worship

We use many kinds of prayers in worship. The Call to Worship is a communal prayer using call and response. The Invocation is a single individual inviting (or invoking) God into our worship this morning. The Prayers of the People uses intercessory prayer to ask God to come to the world's aid. The benediction is a blessing offered over those gathered in worship.

### **The Offertory**

During the offertory music, we pass plates across the pews as a way to make our collective offering to God and the wellbeing of this community. A short doxology follows as we offer our gifts.

This week's offertory was arranged by Florence Price who in 1933 became the first Black woman to have work performed by a major symphony orchestra.
